If you are a victim/witness to a crime, or in need of services, the criminal justice system must have your cooperation to ensure a successful outcome in your case. The criminal justice system stands ready to assist you in your time of need. If you are a victim/witness in need of assistance, please contact the agencies listed in this pamphlet for help, or contact us directly, if:

- Receive threats or intimidation for reporting the crime or acting as a witness.
- Remember or discover new information, discover additional property missing.
- Find or recover your own property, locate serial/model numbers of stolen items.
- Wish to speak with an investigator.
- Observe dangerous driving behavior or any suspicious activity.

CRIME VICTIMS' BILL OF RIGHTS

The Peachtree City Police Department is committed to the development, implementation and perpetuation of the "Victim/Witness Assistance Program" as created and administered through the Fayette County District Attorney's Office, and the State Court Solicitor's Office. In this regard, the Police Department recognizes that:

- Victims and witnesses have a right to be treated with fairness, dignity, and compassion by emergency services, criminal justice personnel, news media, and the general public.
- Victims and witnesses have a right to protection from intimidation and harm.
- Victims and witnesses have a right to be informed concerning the criminal justice process.
- Victims and witnesses have a right to counsel. The Assistant District Attorneys and State Court Solicitors are responsible to protect the interests of victims/witnesses and to explain the case in non-technical terms.
- Victims have a right to restitution for expenses of property loss incurred as the result of a crime (O.C.G.A. 17-15-1). When restitution is ordered, they have a right to have that order enforced. Contact www.cjcc.georgia.gov/victims-compensation. Victims have a right to preservation of property and employment. Victims and witnesses have a right to due process in criminal court proceedings.
- Victims and witnesses have the right to be notified when the accused is released from jail by contacting the Fayette County Sheriff at 770-461-6353.

To apply for a Restraining Order, Temporary Protective Order, or Arrest Warrant:

1. Restraining Order: you must contact an attorney.
2. Temporary Protective Order: you must contact the Promise Place at 770-468-1673, or an attorney.
3. Criminal Arrest Warrant: contact Magistrate Court at 770-716-4230

As a victim of a crime it is easy to feel you have no rights. The domestic violence victim assistance program through Promise Place is here to:

- Give you moral support by providing someone with whom you may talk.
- Give you notice of court hearings and procedures.
- Provide orientation to the courtroom setting.
- Provide a companion to attend court with you and provide emotional support.
- Refer to social service agencies and other groups.
- Refer you to individuals who can help you with personal problems resulting from the crime.
- Assist you with solving problems caused by the necessity of court appearances; for example contacting your employer if you need to miss work.
- Inform the prosecuting attorney of your feelings about the case and any financial losses you may have suffered.
- Provide you with information regarding parole of the defendant and accompany you to the parole board if you desire.
- After an arrest is made, the officer will assist you in making arrangements for your safety. The officer will stand by while you gather items, such as clothing for yourself and your children. The officer will transport you to the house of a friend or family in the Fayette County area or to the police station where you can make arrangements to be transported by an officer to a shelter.
- The officer will also provide the above services if no arrest is made, because the suspect has left the scene, or if there is a lack of probable cause.
