RE: Lake Peachtree

Dear Chairman Brown:

Thank you for your June 12 response. We appreciate the County's willingness to maintain an open line of communication regarding Lake Peachtree. However, in a June 13 email from Steve Rapson, he made us aware for the first time that Fayette County was developing a scope of work for dredging Lake Peachtree. Neither the City leaders nor staff have been contacted by the County to participate in the County's preparation of any scope of work for Lake Peachtree. If there is going to be an open line of communication, then the County should at least involve the City's engineers. Even though the County has not requested our input, we will send to you shortly a proposed scope of work for the dredging of Lake Peachtree.

You made the statement that "Fayette County intends to honor its agreement with Peachtree City as set forth by the original 1966 Agreement which has been modified several times since then." To ensure that we are reviewing and considering the same agreement documents, please provide me with a copy of all the agreements and modifications the County has pertaining to Lake Peachtree. In addition, please provide me with copies of all engineering studies/reports that the County or its departments have undertaken or commissioned from 1966 to present with respect to Lake Peachtree, any of its associated structures, and any dredging of Lake Peachtree. Also, please provide me with copies of any documents pertaining to inspections and/or maintenance of Lake Peachtree or any of its associated structures. Please include any documents that reflect the cost incurred for such inspections, maintenance or dredging activities.

We look forward to participating fully in the discussions concerning the County's repair or replacement of the spillway; but while those discussions proceed, we believe that the County should be working towards dredging the sedimentation build-up while the Lake is below its normal pool level. I look forward to our continued dialogue and timely resolution of these issues.
